

Subject: Final Response to Request for Access to Information



This is in response to your request for access to information of The City of Calgary ("The City") in accordance with the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* ("FOIP Act"), received May 13, 2021.

The City Human Resources business unit searched for the requested records based on the terms provided in your request, and have failed to produce records related to this access request.

Section 65 of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* provides that an applicant may make a written request to the Office of Information and Privacy Commissioner of Alberta ("OIPC") to review this decision. 


