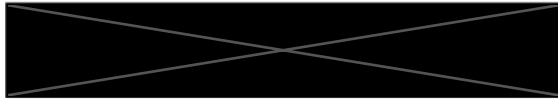

Dear Kristen Schulz:

**Re: Your request for access to information under Part 2 of *The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FIPPA)*
Our File Nos. 2023-012**

On January 20, 2023, Manitoba Environment and Climate (MEC) received your request for the following records:

2023-012

"Please provide documentation on the impact to the province's electricity system and ratepayers due to the federal government's decision to require 100 % of all passenger cars and trucks solid by 2035 to be zero emission. Please be sure to include any estimates or analysis on changes necessary to power generation needs, transmission requirements, local distribution infrastructure, household upgrades and the cost to customers. Please also provide copies of any materials provided to the federal government related to this topic and their announcement. From March 1, 2021 to present."

MEC has conducted a search for records and can advise you that the records you have requested do not exist. As such, subsection 12(1)(c)(i) of FIPPA has been administered.

Contents of response

12(1) In a response under section 11, the head of the public body shall inform the applicant

(c) if access to the record or part of the record is refused,

(i) in the case of a record that does not exist or cannot be located, that the record does not exist or cannot be located

Subsection 59(1) of *The Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* provides that you may make a complaint about this decision to the Manitoba Ombudsman. You have 60 days from the receipt of this notice to make a complaint on the prescribed form to:
