Please provide the most recent data on the number of patients in the province (or best estimate) who are:

- Currently on a waiting list or waiting to be placed on a waiting list for surgery or a procedure
- Currently on a waiting list or waiting to be placed on a waiting list for a diagnostic scan
- Currently on a waiting list or waiting to be placed on a waiting list for an appointment with a specialist

Please be sure to note the date the data was compiled. (Date Range for Record Search: From 04/14/2025 To 04/15/2025)

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The current waitlist for surgery as of Monday 14th April is 75,064

- This reflects all Adult Acute Care sites including where waiting for care at CSF sites (i.e. excludes Pediatric hospitals)
- Cases are excluded where they are GI-Endoscopy only
- Cases are excluded where waiting at a CSF if the "scheduled" date is past the reporting date.
 This adjustment is done due to a lag in receiving completed records for those cases.
- Cases may count more then once for a patient if they are scheduled for multiple surgeries/procedures to occur on separate dates.

Total Count: 256,019 Referrals Waiting

- 193,136 referrals are on workqueues (awaiting triage, initial scheduling, or in some cases rescheduling).
- 62,883 referrals are scheduled for future initial appointments that have not yet occurred.

Limitations to Note

- Comparability to Past (Important): These figures should not be compared to counts provided in the past (e.g. 2024 or 2023). This is because there are more departments using Connect Care now, which previously would not have been included in the counts. Since the last time this report was provided, for instance, there have been several Connect Care launches that have added new clinics to the system.
- Only includes clinics that have gone live with Connect Care, and are using the referrals module.
- Does not include referrals waiting for follow-up or treatment after an initial appointment. In Connect Care, referrals normally close and exit this count as soon as they complete their initial consult or appointment. This, I assume, should be fine because follow-ups are not normally considered part of waitlist counts.
- Does not include non-AHS providers and clinics, which is a massive chunk of specialty care in Alberta.
- Does not include data from legacy systems, due to limitations with those systems in capturing referral data.
- Does not include AHS care that is paper-based or otherwise not using enterprise systems to record referrals.
- Includes all types of specialty care providers, not just specialist physicians. This may mean some
 referrals are for therapists, nurses, social workers, counselors, etc. as well as specialist
 physicians (we do not know the provider type while the referral is waitlisted).
