Dear Ms. Schulz:

I am responding to your request for access to records under the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (the *Act*). Your request was for:

Please provide data on the number of patients that died while on a waiting list for either a diagnostic scan or a consultation with a specialist in fiscal year 2024-25.

Please break the data out by scan/consultation and case info – date the patient went on the waiting list, date for the meeting with a specialist or date for diagnostic scan (if scheduled), and date of cancellation.

Please also note the government's target time for providing the consultation or scan in question. (Note: many hospitals/health regions were able to identify such cases as they track the reason for cancelled operations).

Please find attached a record created to respond to your request, while protecting patient confidentiality.

Please note the following to accompany the data and aid in interpretation of the data:

- In Fiscal Year 2024/25, there were 339 patients that had a medical imaging exam cancelled due to a reason of Patient Deceased.
- The reason for patient death is not documented in Island Health diagnostic imaging systems; this report cannot be used to determine a correlation between the imaging exam modality (type of exam) or the wait time for the exam and patient death.
- This report includes medical imaging that were cancelled as Patient Deceased between April 1, 2024 and March 31, 2025

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- The exam is added to the waitlist as of the received date for the exam orders
- Not all patients receive a scheduled date for the exam while on the waitlist
- Deaths were grouped as either falling within the exam benchmark (varying from 7 to 60 days, dependent on physician assigned urgency) or exceeding the benchmark

With respect to those who may have died while on a waiting list for a consultation with a specialist, Island Health does not have access to this information. Referrals for consultations with a specialist would typically come from the physician's office and this information is not currently tracked by Island Health.

Under section 52 of the *Act*, you may ask the Information and Privacy Commissioner to review Island Health's response to your request. You have 30 days from receipt of this notice to request a review by writing to the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner. I have enclosed information on the review and complaint process.

I trust that your request for records has now been satisfied and that no further action with regard to your file is required of this office. If this is not the case, or if you have any questions regarding the matter, please contact me via email.
